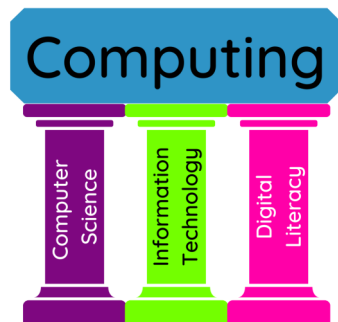

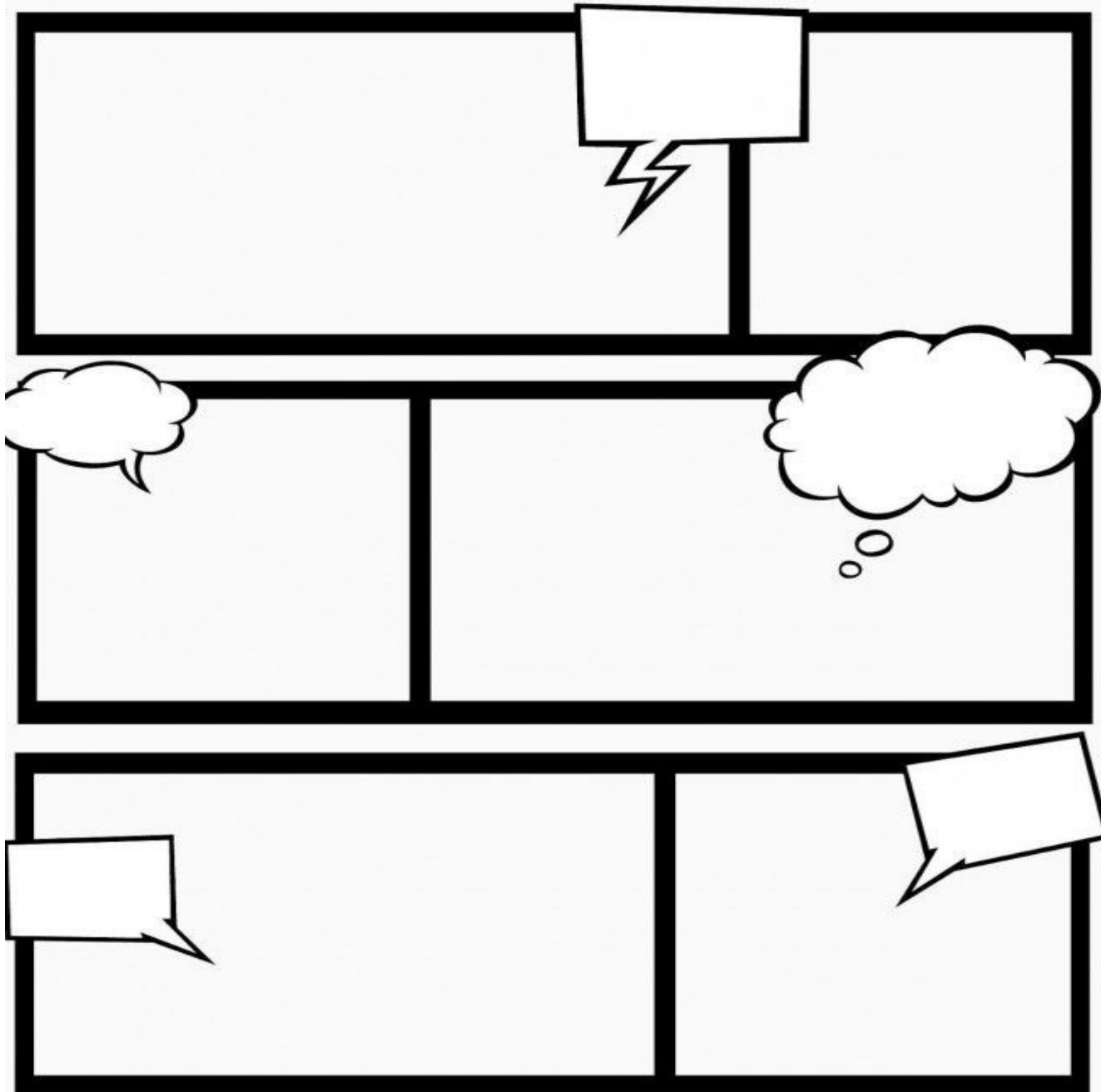


Competition Zone.
