New Homework System

I am writing to inform you about an important update regarding the homework system we have been implementing in our school over recent academic years. As you may know, we have been utilising the EdShed platform to provide optional homework tasks. This system was introduced following consultations with families which highlighted the diverse needs and expectations regarding homework across our school community. We recognise that there is no one-size-fits-all approach that can cater to every family's circumstances. As only a very small minority of families are accessing the homework tasks on EdShed, we are rolling out a new approach from January.

Beginning January 2025, we will be recommending a **CGP Targeted Question Book** for each year group. The books can be purchased at many retailers but are available on Amazon:

Year 6 already have their homework books which were purchased at the beginning of the year. These will continue to be used.

We encourage parents who wish to complete homework with their children to purchase these books as they will align with the curriculum and enhance your child's learning experience at home. For families whose children are entitled to free school meals, a copy of the recommended homework book can be requested the link below:

Teachers will assign a weekly task from the homework book that is designed to complement the learning undertaken in the classroom. The specific page number to be completed will be communicated via Class Dojo every Friday. The answers for all activities are in the book of the homework book. Children will hand their completed and marked homework book to their teacher on a weekly basis. The teachers will look at the tasks the children have completed to ensure any challenges or misconceptions are promptly identified and addressed.

Our goal in introducing this homework book is to make assignments more accessible for families who wish to reinforce their children's learning at home. It is important to note that while these activities are encouraged, they will remain optional, and it is not obligatory for you to purchase the book. The essential components of homework are as follows:

- Spellings weekly
- Engaging with Times tables Rock Stars at least once per week
- Read 5 times a week at home and record this in their reading records. It is expected that at least one signature from an adult who has listened to them read at home per week will be in their reading record- This will be checked during 1:1 reading.

Children have access to the padlet for extra reading homework. Children who cannot access the padlet at home have the opportunity to do so once a week at school during their padlet day in the library

Those students who demonstrate a commitment to their learning by completing assigned homework tasks may receive Dojo points as a reward.

We appreciate your continued support and partnership in your child's education and hope that this new system provides a homework option to suit all families. Should you have any queries or require further clarification regarding these updates, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Year 4 Symphony Hall Trip

Year 4 will be going on a school trip to see a schools' concert at Symphony Hall on **10th February 2025.** This is a wonderful opportunity for them to visit one of the country's premier concert spaces and see a full orchestra perform.

The performance begins at 1.30PM and should last one hour. Children will travel by coach, leaving school at 11.45am and should return to school by approximately 4.00pm

As we are leaving school early, a packed lunch will be required, so that your child can eat in school before going. If your child is entitled to free school meals, this can be ordered from our kitchen. Children will need to wear full school uniform please.

Year 4 Residential- Kingswood

We are very pleased to inform you that we are able to offer a **one night** residential to **Kingswood Outdoor Education Centre** in Staffordshire, for our Year 4 children. The trip is open to the whole year group and will take place on **Thursday 8th** to **Friday 9th May 2025.**

During the 2 days we will take part in a wide range of activities, which are organised and supervised by qualified instructors. Kingswood will provide breakfast, a mixture of hot and cold lunches and dinner. However, the children will need a packed lunch for the day of arrival.

During the trip we will be encouraging independent skills and good team work by combining an action-packed programme of daytime activities with an array of evening entertainment. Your child can get outdoors and stay active whilst making memories with their friends!

The total cost of the trip will be **£148.50**. A deposit of **£50** will be required to secure your child's place and this is to be paid via School Gateway no later than 31st January. Any additional payments can be paid in full or two instalments of £49.25 with the first payment being made on 28th February and the final instalment on 28th March

I am sure that you will appreciate that if the vast majority of parents do not agree to make the full payment the visit will be unviable and will therefore be cancelled.

It is our hope that the visit will be affordable to the vast majority of families as we see this as a valuable learning opportunity.

If you wish for your child to attend the Year 4 residential, please complete form by Friday 29th November to secure your child's place. Please do not hesitate to contact a member of the year 4 team if you have any questions regarding the trip and we will be happy to help.

A parent's information meeting will be held on Tuesday 8th April at 3:15pm to share more details about the trip.

In the meantime, I thought I would provide you with some FAQs in order to help families discuss the trip with the children and decide if you would like your child to attend.

Kingswood FAQs

What time will the children go to bed?

The children will have an evening campfire. After this activity (approx. 8.30pm) the children will go to the dormitories, have a wash and brush their teeth before having 30 minutes quiet down time before lights out.

Do teachers sleep in the rooms?

No. The teachers will be in rooms nearby. Teachers' rooms are clearly labelled with our names and the children know where to find us.

What happens if my child is upset at bedtime?

We will look after any children who are upset with care and nurture. If your child is too upset and does not settle, we will give you a call. Sometimes children just want some reassurance over the phone. On some occasions, children need to be collected. If they are collected, they can come back for breakfast the next day.

Do I get a reduced cost of my child does not stay the night?

Unfortunately, the cost will remain the same as no reduction in cost is offered from Kingswood.

My child is a fussy eater. I am worried they will be hungry. What can I do?

It is unusual that there is nothing at all they children won't eat from the options provided. However, to avoid a potential issue, in extreme circumstances, families have provided a bag of 'emergency food' we can keep to one side and use if required. We will never let a child go hungry.

Will my child choose who they are in a dormitory with?

The children will be consulted and will be placed with some friends of their choice. We do not tell the children who they will be with until we arrive as on occasions last minute changes have needed to be made.

How much time will the children spend In the dorms?

Very little. The are very busy throughout both days.

Can my child take their phone or tablet?

No. This is not possible due to safeguarding. School will post regular updates on Dojo.

My child needs medication- can this be given?

This is no problem at all. We will be sending out paperwork for you to complete and medication will be signed in on the day.

What activities will my child be taking part in?

The programme of activities is not yet finalised. However, last year the children have various team building activities such as shelter building and buggy building. The children also took part in a climbing activity on a climbing wall. The children are encouraged to take part in everything and push themselves but they are never forced to do something they are not comfortable doing.

My child has occasional bed wetting incidents. Are the still able to come?

Absolutely. If your child has any night time issues such as bed wetting or sleep walking, please give Mrs Nash a call. We will discuss how we can support your child and ensure they have a fabulous time.

4S will be swimming next term. Swimming will begin on Monday 6th January at St Regis Secondary School. Swimming will take place during the afternoon.

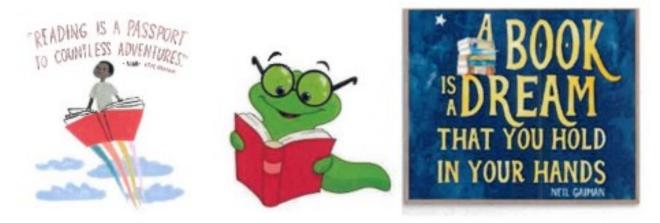

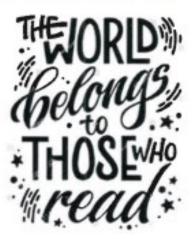
