Pupils' stories of Hope read by award-winning author

Over 500 children in Years 3 – 11 from across Wolverhampton entered this year's Wolverhampton Young Authors' Prize competition with their original short stories based around the theme of 'Hope'. 108 Finalists from Wolverhampton Grammar School, Christ Church Junior School, Highfields School, Caldmore Primary Academy, Codsall High School, Beacon Hill Academy, Poole Hayes Academy and St Jude's Cofe Academy were invited to attend the Grand Final which was held at Wolverhampton Grammar School on Tuesday 14th February.

Award-winning children's author, Cliff McNish, attended the event to share his advice with the budding young authors and to announce the winners who have had their stories read and recorded by Cliff himself. Cliff is best-known for his debut fantasy series *The Doomspell Trilogy*, which has been published in twenty-six languages worldwide.

Congratulations to the winners who were selected from three categories: Years 3 – 5: Dylan (Wolverhampton Grammar School), Years 6 – 8: Sophia (Christ Church Junior School) and Years 9 – 11: Sophie (Codsall High School). Three runners-up were also announced, alongside four 'highly commended' stories; amongst the runners' up was Wolverhampton Grammar School student, Siya (Year 4).

The prize which is in its third year, was created by WGS librarians Zoe Rowley and Duncan McAllister to inspire children and young people across the region to read and write for pleasure. WGS Head Librarian Zoe Rowley said, "We were delighted to see hundreds of young people from across Wolverhampton enter this year's competition. The 400 word challenge encouraged young people to showcase their writing skills and create a unique story. It was a pleasure to meet over 100 finalists for the competition at Wolverhampton Grammar School today. To hear their winning stories performed by award-winning author Cliff McNish, will be a memory that these children will cherish for a lifetime. We hope that this year's competition has inspired young people to continue reading and writing for pleasure."

Children 8-16 can swim for free too if a parent takes proof of council tax payment to Wolverhampton City Council when they go to the baths.



STEM Project

To celebrate British Science Week and all things STEM, we are holding our own STEM competition! We would love the children to create their own STEM project at home which demonstrates their own understanding of 'Connections'. For example, children could look at connections to nature, how we need to be more connected to the planets, connections in our local area to STEM jobs, connections between elements and science topics.....the list could go on, the possibilities are endless! We want to know your child's take on this STEM theme. We would be very grateful if you could support your children in their project, discussing the STEM theory behind their work.

If children wish to enter, they need to bring their project along with an explanation of the STEM behind their work. to class on Monday 27th March.

Each project will be celebrated, however one winner will be chosen from each class and will receive a certificate. These winners will be entered into our STEM fair, where we will have external visitors judge and select a winner from each year group on Thursday 30th March.

STEM Day

As part of STEM day, we will be answering our big question 'Can older children always hold more sweets?'

To make our experiment as fun and engaging as possible, if you are able, we would like every child to come to school with a large bag of **wrapped** sweets that can be used within the experiment e.g chewits, starbursts. We will not be consuming this confectionery, but simply be using it to have fun and answer our question. We would like to remind parents that Christ Church is a nut free school.
